Abstract:

The seminar invited the singer of the popular song “Siu Ming Visits Guangzhou”, Dr. Lee Kan Yan, David to demonstrate the influence and importance of learning from happiness.

Dr. Lee is a well-know paediatrician in Hong Kong, he graduated at the Hong Kong University Medical Faculty, then he received further oversea paediatric training in the U.K. and obtained his FRCPCH in 1997. Dr. Lee has a strong interest in music when he was young. When he became a doctor, he found out that happiness and music are the most valuable assets in his life. Dr. Lee not only enjoys the music, he also shares the happiness to others. In his spare time, he will compose children's songs and perform them. He wants to bring the happiness to everyone by performing his children's songs. When children experience positive emotions, the learning process can be enhanced. The happiness and joy can increase the children's motivation of learning.

In this seminar, Dr. Alice Lai will present her new book “Learning Difficulties in Reading and Writing: How Difficult it Can Be?”. Dr. Lai illustrates the learning difficulties in the new book with her 20 years teaching experiences. Learning difficulties are inherent, but the difficulties can affect by external factors such as environment and emotions.
